2. GUIDANCE

- Clarkson University Achievement Award – Kelley Finucane

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who demonstrates outstanding academic achievement. This award automatically carries a \$36,000 (\$9,000.00 per year) tuition scholarship if recipient chooses to enroll at Clarkson University.

- Clarkson University Leadership Award – Siobhan Brady

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who demonstrates outstanding leadership qualities and is recognized by faculty and students as having been a positive contributor to the school and community. This award automatically carries a \$44,000 (\$11,000 per year) tuition scholarship if recipient chooses to enroll at Clarkson University.

- Harvard Prize Book Award – Danielle Arthur

Established in 1910 by Harvard Alumni to recognize outstanding students in the next to graduating class who "display excellence in scholarship and high character, combined with achievement in other fields."

- ❑ I Dare You Awards - Jodie Antoniadis, Christina Douglas, Alexis Florczak, Kelly Mroz, Emily Rodgers

These awards were first offered in 1941 by William H. Danforth, a successful business man who dared young people to achieve their highest potential and to influence others through lives of leadership and service. He believed that each individual can make a difference by demonstrating personal integrity, leading well-rounded lives, and possessing a willingness to assume responsibility.

- ❑ Rochester Institute of Technology - Computing Medal and Scholarship Program - Christine Stout

This medal is awarded to a member of the junior class who has demonstrated leadership in school and community. This Computer Medal scholarship is valued at \$12,000 if the recipient is accepted and enrolls at RIT. This scholarship is not limited to a computing-related discipline and may be used to support study in any undergraduate program at RIT.

- ❑ Saint Michael's College Book Award - Jenna Wegrzyn

This award recognizes a junior who is a member of the National Honor Society and demonstrates a sustained and sincere commitment to community service activities through their high school or organizations within the community.

- ❑ University of Rochester - Frederick Douglass and Susan B. Anthony Award & Scholarship in Humanities and Social Sciences - Andrea DeRosa

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who demonstrates academic achievements, leadership and community service. The recipient of this award is automatically considered for the Frederick Douglass and Susan B. Anthony Scholarship which provides each qualified student \$6,000.00 per year.

- ❑ University of Rochester - George Eastman Young Leaders Award and Scholarship - Natalie Coppola

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who demonstrates strong leadership, maintains high grades, and participates in challenging courses. The recipient of this award is automatically considered for the George Eastman Young Leaders Scholarship which provides each qualified student \$6,000.00 per year.

- ❑ Wells College - 21st Century Leadership Award - Mary Stottele

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who has made outstanding contributions as a student and a leader. The recipient of this award is automatically considered for the Century Leadership Award which provides each qualified student \$20,000 for four years of study at Wells College.
